**Q: What kind of music do you like?** A: Hip-hop, Old R&B, Acoustic

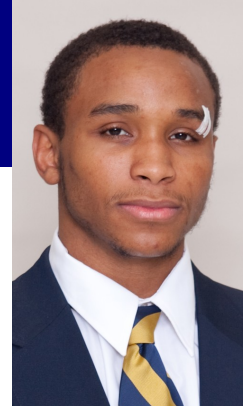
**Q: What do you like to do in your spare time?** A: I Draw, Paint & Research music endlessly
